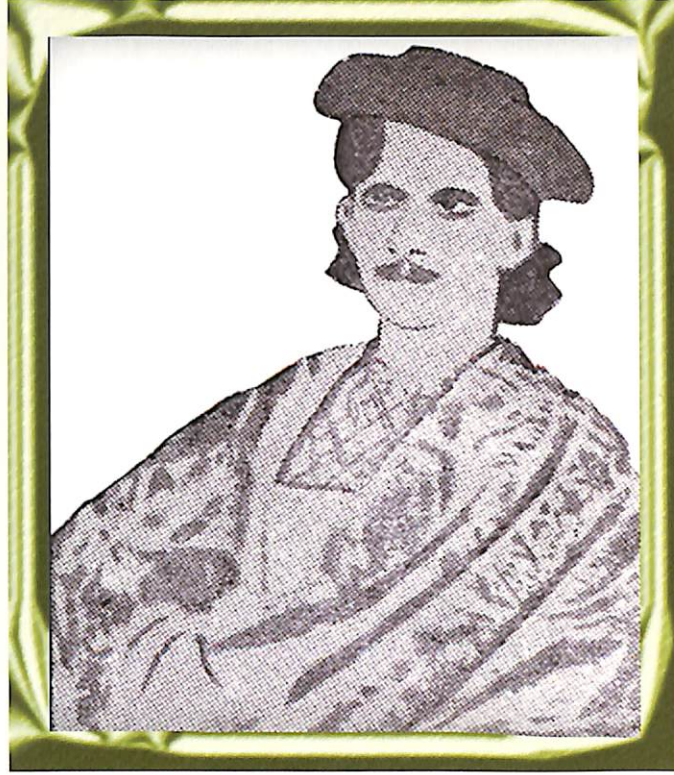

FOREWORD

Anandaram Dhekial Phookan College (A.D.P. College) is a seat of learning that celebrated its Golden Jubilee concluding ceremony in 2009. Named after Anandaram Dhekial Phookan, an illustrious son of Assam, who struggled hard to establish the fact about the excellence of Assamese language and who desired all along to see a prosperous, beautiful Assam, the college caters for higher education needs of an educationally backward district of Assam like Nagaon as well as of the state.



Situated in a serene atmosphere away from din and bustle of the town life though within the town the college offers an ideal surrounding dotted with green, luxury and foliage for teaching– learning atmosphere. About one and half km. south of the N.H.37 from the point of Morigaon Bus Station, the college is sprawled over an area of eight bighas land on the North-Bank of river Kolong. 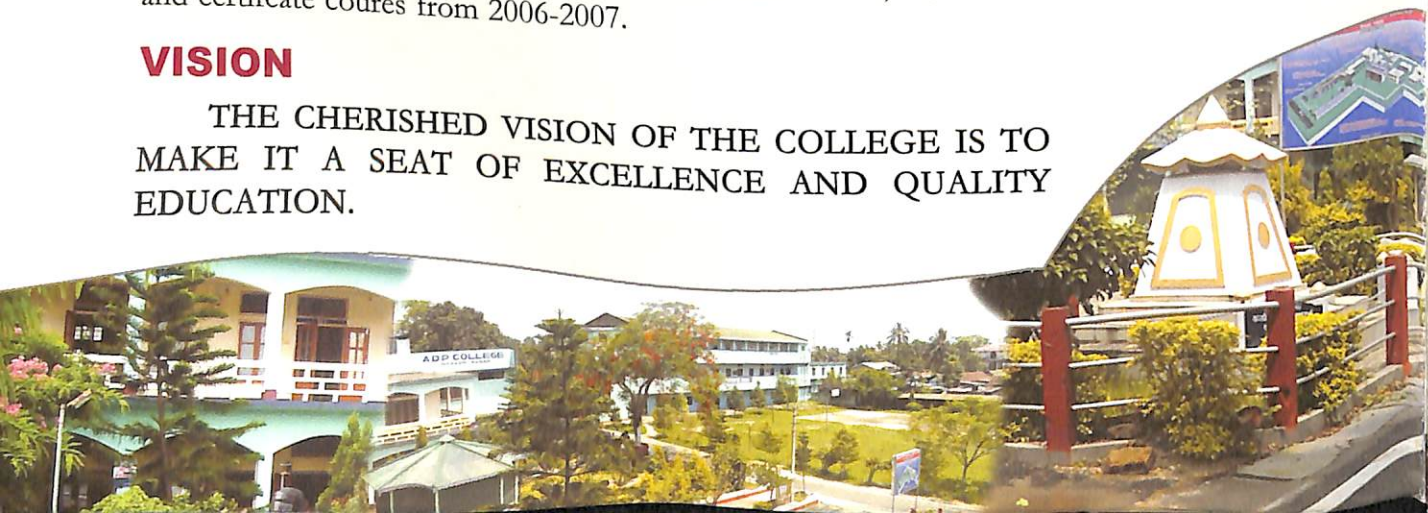
GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE COLLEGE

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT :

In an effort to bring up the existing infrastructure into higher level of growth, construction of buildings are in progress. All the existing science laboratories are equipped with new edition of sophisticated instruments. Mention may be made of instruments like research microscope with camera, leminas flow and spectro photometre for the department of Botany.

The college has digital classroom facilities in science subjects equipped with facilities like LCD Projector, Kiosk Board, Audio & Video gadget etc. It has opened a language laboratory in the first floor of Golden Jubilee commemorative building.

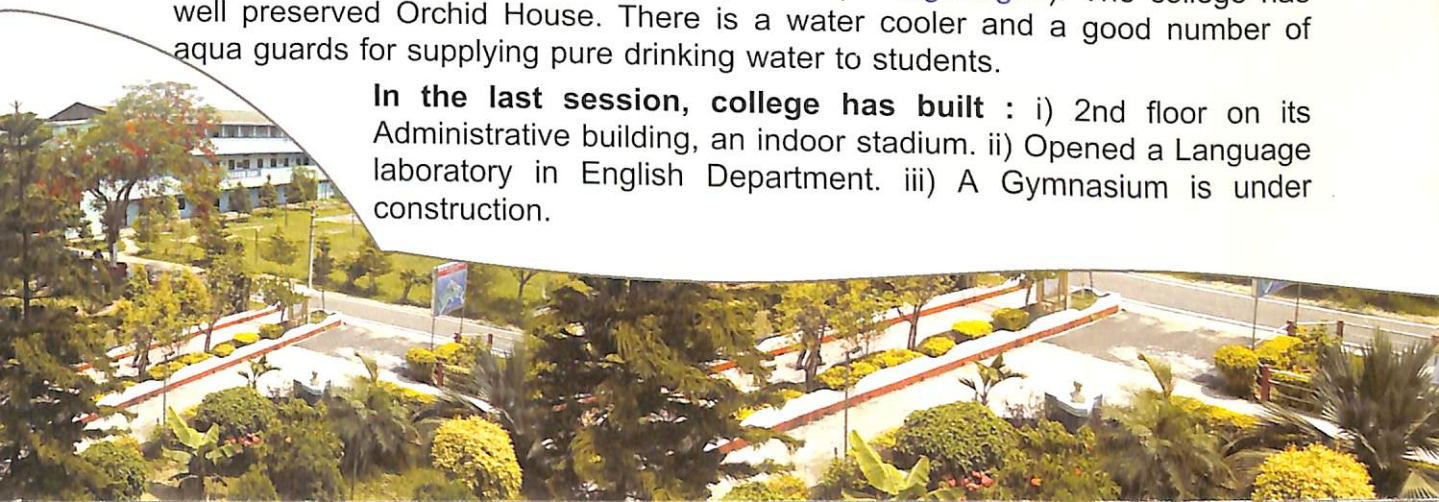
The institution has set up a 20 KVA Eco friendly silent generator for power back up to the campus during power failure. It too has a separate power line with 100 KVA transformer solely for the campus use.

The college has provided computers to each department. The college has wireless network connectivity that provides unlimited internet connectivity inside the college campus. It too has an Amenities centre where Xerox, Internet, Public Call, Lamination, DTP facilities, spiral binding at reasonal rate are available.

The college has newly build two storied Chemistry Building and a Canteen.

The college has its own website (www.adpcollege.org.in). The college has well preserved Orchid House. There is a water cooler and a good number of aqua guards for supplying pure drinking water to students.

In the last session, college has built : i) 2nd floor on its Administrative building, an indoor stadium. ii) Opened a Language laboratory in English Department. iii) A Gymnasium is under construction.





COMPUTER CENTRE

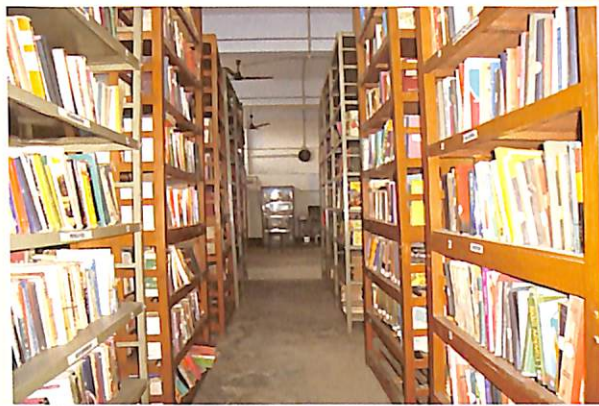
There is a state of the art Computer Centre in the college premises with sufficient number of computers. The centre is equipped with Broadband Internet facility. The centre is run by Department of Computer Science.

LIBRARY

The A.D.P. College Central Library has altogether 42,170 books which includes text books, reference books, general books relating to Science and Arts streams. Besides this, the library also developed special collection on Gandhian Philosophy, Fashion Designing and Competitive Examinations.

The Library remains open on all working days from 10A.M. to 4P.M. excluding Sundays and govt. holidays.

The reading room in the first floor of the library building is equipped with 24 Magazines, 8 nos. of news papers and a good number of reference books offering much more facilities for the students. Membership of the library is open to teacher, students and non teaching staff of the college. A student is provided with a card with the facility to borrow two books at a time for 15 days. A major student gets the privilege for borrowing 4 books at a time. Students are to follow library rules. They must return the library card at the end of the session. Apart from this the library provides different types of services to its users. They are— lending service, reference service, photocopying service, fax and Internet service etc.



In the area of library automation the college library installed SOUL Software in 2006. At present data entry in SOUL is going on and it is expected to be completed within a short period of time. Students of Science stream can use Online Public Access catalogue(OPAC) for searching their desired books.

Admission Requirements

- i. Students seeking admission to the college shall have to apply in prescribed form available with the Prospectus.
- ii. The completely filled up admission form must be submitted to the office of the college within the stipulated date.
- iii. The candidate must obtain a receipt from the office as a record of submission of the form, which may be kept in person till the admission procedure is completed.
- iv. Candidates need to submit photocopies of documents, but they have to produce them in original at the time of admission.
- v. The testimonials, in original to be produced at the time of admission are-
 - (a) Mark sheet and Pass Certificate of the last examination.
 - (b) HSLC Certificate / Admit Card for Age verification.
 - (c) Character Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
 - (d) Caste Certificate/ Gap Certificate/ Migration Certificate/ Disability Certificate (if any).
 - (e) Certificate of NCC, Games, Sports, cultural activities (district level or higher) for Admission under Rule 6(4).
 - (f) Registration card of AHSEC/GU.

Eligibility For Admission

- i. Right of admission is reserved by the college authority.
- ii. Students are admitted on Merit Basis only.
- iii. Reservation of seats for ST/SC/OBC will be in accordance with the rules existing at the time of admission.
- iv. Preference will be given to students having proficiency of high standard in extra curricular activities under existing rules, giving bonus marks 5% of total marks secured. The quota is limited.





- v. Seats remained vacant after application of rules iii and iv above will be filled by general category candidates.
- vi. Students who have appeared in T.D.C. part I and part II Examination must get themselves admitted by depositing requisite fees as per date (s) fixed by the college authority.

Attendance

1. Students failing to attend a minimum of 75% classes in each subject will not be eligible to appear in any final examination.
2. Continuous absence for 25 days in a class is enough to debar the concerned student from attending the class / from appearing in the examination.
3. Scholarship holders with less than 75% attendance may be deprived of the scholarship.

College Examination

TDC Semester System :

20% of total marks comes from internal assessment / evaluation and rest 80% from end semester evaluation. There shall be atleast one sessional examination in each semester.

TDC Annual System :

10% of total marks comes from internal assessment / evaluation and rest 90% from final examination. In an Academic year a student has to appear in the following examinations conducted by the college.

- (a) Unit Tests.
- (b) Test Examination.

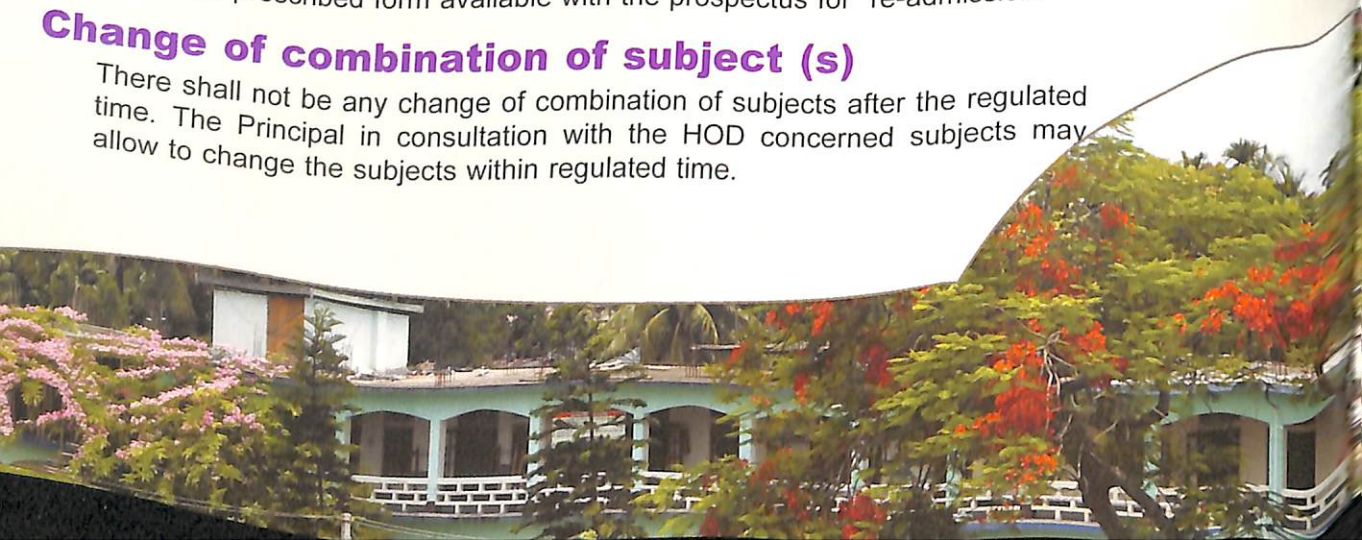
30% of the marks of unit tests will be added to the marks obtained in the test examination, to declare the eligibility of a student to appear in final examination.

There shall not be any change of combination of subjects after the regulated time. The Principal in consultation with the HOD concerned subjects may allow to change the subjects within regulated time.

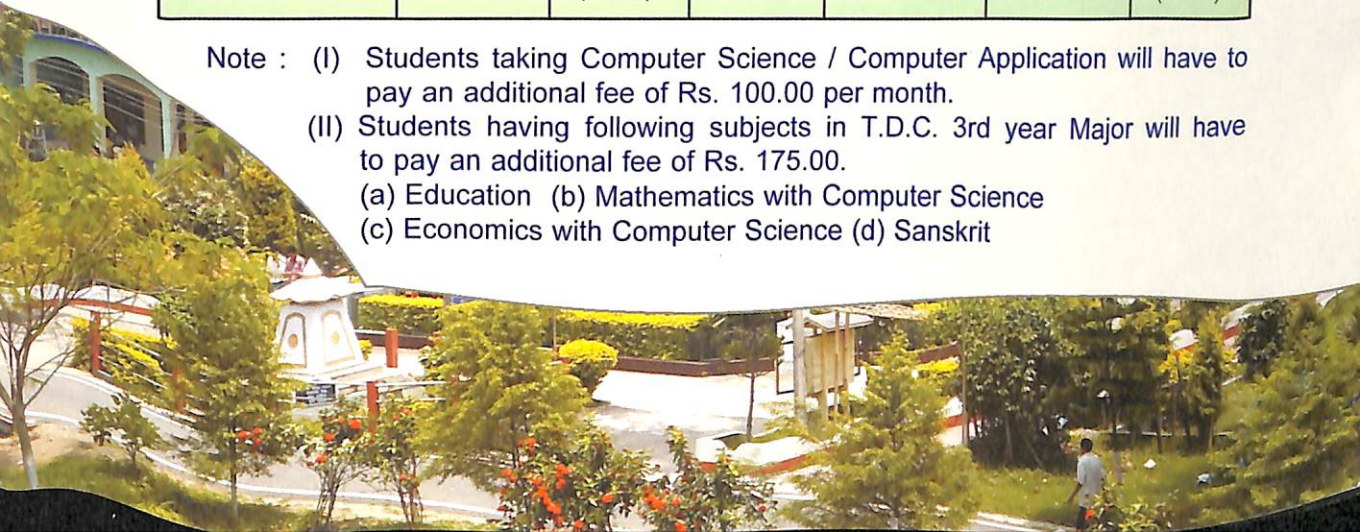

On application, the needy students get aid in terms of cash or books from this Fund subject to fund position, provided the authority is satisfied with his/her conduct and overall performance in all aspects.

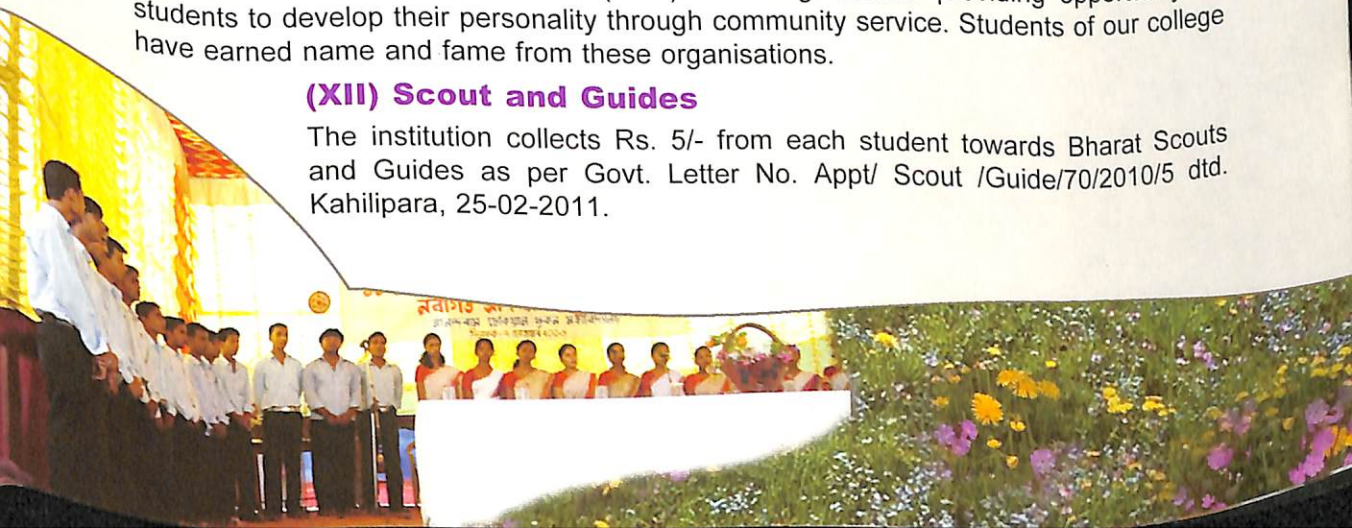
(XI) NCC & NSS
